Keynote Speaker

Frank Lavin

U.S. and the World – Embracing the Challenges with Confidence

In addition to his government service, Frank has held leadership roles in global banking and corporate strategy, advising businesses on navigating complex international markets. His insights on political risk, economic trends, and U.S. foreign policy make him a sought-after speaker for conferences, corporate events, and leadership forums.

Known for his lighthearted and engaging style, Frank delivers sharp analysis with a touch of humor, making even complex topics accessible and thought-provoking. Navigating AI and the Deepfake Challenges in Community Banking
